

## WAFC JUNIOR FOOTBALL COMPETITION POLICIES, RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR 2023

Please find attached the WA Football Commission's Junior Football Competition Policies, Rules and Regulations for the 2023 season.

The amendments made to the policies, rules and regulations continue to build on the improvements made in previous seasons. The WAFC Competitions Team have reviewed the document to ensure alignment with the AFL's National Community Football Policy Handbook.

You will notice changes to the order of policies, rules and regulations as well as removal of some sections to present a much more organised and clearer Competition handbook. Also included are several new or amended rules for the 2023 season, based on changes to National policies and our Metro Junior Competition teams proposals resulting from feedback received from Junior Clubs and officials. A summary of changes is included below. Thank you to all clubs and officials who provided feedback, it is much appreciated and helped shape rule changes for this season.

## The handbook aims to:

- make it easier for clubs, volunteers and other stakeholders to administer Australian Football;
- provide a framework for key organisational requirements in relation to Australian Football;
- address appropriate standards of behaviour and the prevention of discrimination and harassment; and
- ensure that the game of Australian Football is played in a fair manner and a spirit of true sportsmanship.

All stakeholders are strongly recommended to read, review, and become familiar with the 2023 WAFC Junior Football Competition Policies, Rules and Regulations, which are available on the WAFC Kia Club hub website (<a href="https://www.clubhub.wafc.com.au">www.clubhub.wafc.com.au</a>) for your use.
